

## KIKUYU var. Whittet



Kikuyu grass is a low growing, warm season vigorous grass that spreads by stolons & runners. Whittet, improved Kikuyugrass (*Pennisetum clandestinum*) is the popular choice for Turf Managers throughout Australia when choosing a seeded variety. Whittet has broader leaves, thicker stems & will establish & persist better on poor soils with low fertility.

### Uses

Grows well where other grasses won't.  
Ideal for low maintenance turf areas.  
Excellent for erosion control on hillsides & banks.

### Seeding Rates

New Turf – 50kg's/Ha is recommended but can be increased to 100Kg's/Ha for quicker establishment. Sow seed in late Spring/Summer or when temperatures are in the 18°-25° range. Irrigation is important in the initial sowings, until such time as an adequate cover is achieved.

### Maintenance

Mowing heights are recommended at 25-50mm.  
Frequent mowing will keep thatch build ups to a reasonable level.
